Sermon: Part 11: *“I Am Making Everything New!”*

Sin is rebellion against God and it's missing the mark of what God would want for our lives.

“I am making everything new! ... Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true. ... It is done.”
(Revelation 21:5-6)

Jesus saying that all things will be made new is the _____ that began on the cross and will continue until everything is restored again.

An infinite God can die for infinite sins.

“It is finished” meaning it is “paid in full.”

To believe in the death and resurrection of Jesus is to believe in God.

“It is done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. To the thirsty I will give water without cost from the spring of the water of life.” (Revelation 21:6)

“I Am Making Everything New” Means:

1. God will make _____ new

“Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!” (2 Corinthians 5:17)

2. God will make our _____ new

Scripture referenced in sermon message: 2 Corinthians 5:18-20

We are Jesus’ ambassadors and representatives of what reconciliation looks like because we ourselves have experienced reconciliation with God.

3. God will make things right in this world by vanquishing all _____ forever

And the devil, who deceived them, was thrown into the lake of burning sulfur, where the beast and the false prophet had been thrown. They will be tormented day and night for ever and ever. (Revelation 20:10)

“You will not certainly die...” (Genesis 3:4)



4. God will make our _____ new

Then I saw “a new Heaven and a new Earth,” for the first Heaven and the first Earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of Heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, “Look! God’s dwelling place is now among the people, and He will dwell with them. They will be His people, and God Himself will be with them and be their God. ‘He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death’ or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away.” (Revelation 21:1-4)

For followers of Jesus, we will be face to face with God, the One whom we have put our faith in, the One that sacrificed Himself so that we could be saved from sin.

5. God will make all things _____

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, as clear as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb down the middle of the great street of the city. On each side of the river stood the tree of life, bearing twelve crops of fruit, yielding its fruit every month. And the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. No longer will there be any curse. The throne of God and of the Lamb will be in the city, and His servants will serve Him. They will see His face, and His Name will be on their foreheads. There will be no more night. They will not need the light of a lamp or the light of the sun, for the Lord God will give them light. And they will reign for ever and ever. (Revelation 22:1-5)

When Jesus says, “I make all things new,” it means that one day we will be free from the consequences and effects of sin and death, rot and decay.

Bottom Line: *With Jesus, the old is gone and the new is here. He will make all things new.*

Questions to reflect on this week or with others:

- 1. Knowing that God is making all things new, now and for eternity, how does that give you hope and encouragement with your own brokenness and with the injustices that you see in your life and in the lives of those around you?*
- 2. How can you share this hope of Heaven and all things being made new with those around you?*
- 3. Knowing that everything will be made right and that followers of Jesus will be in a forever place of no mores, how does that influence how you are trusting God with your life and with your circumstances today?*
