5 Commonalities Among The 25% Who Continued To Follow Jesus After Childhood:

- 1. Eating dinner with family five to seven nights a week
- 2. Serving with their family in a ministry
- 3. Having one spiritual experience in the home during the week
- 4. Being entrusted with responsibility in ministry at an early age
- 5. Having at least one faith-focused adult in their life, other than their parents (Barna Group)

What Can We All Do As A Community?

1. Parents and Guardians of Children Under 18: Our invitation from God is to make Jesus the priority of our family

a. Make church a priority

- b. Actively disciple our children
- 2. Everyone: Consider pouring into the lives of other children and youth
 - a. Consider joining Kids City
 - b. Consider joining Youth Ministry
